Expertise

The initials ADJ refer to Duc Anne de Joyeuse, a local historical figure from the 16th century. During the 1990s, ADJ made a spectacular quality policy change that repositioned it as a specialist in varietal wines. Its vineyards extend for a radius of 30 kilometres around Limoux. The altitude tempers the climate and promotes the expression of Pinot Noirs and Chardonnays. ADJ is also at the cutting edge in providing technical support for wine growers and a pioneer in the environmental field.
